Metro Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Stakeholder Advisory Meeting November 4th, 2024

www.MetroBRTProject.com (launched September 2024)

Recap

- The November 4th meeting was the second stakeholder meeting
- Project will cost over \$300 million; they are hoping this will be the first phase and that additional corridors will be constructed in the future
- At the previous meeting they allowed time for concerns to be shared
- Project timeline
 - o Summer 2024: new interactive website for information and feedback
 - Fall 2024: station design input
 - Winter 2025/2026: BRT design completion
 - o 2026: construction begins
 - Fall 2027: Reading Road BRT service begins
 - o Summer 2028: Hamilton Avenue BRT service begins
- Engagement timeline

- They are going after a federal grant that would cover 80% of funding
- Currently working on identifying community priorities, opportunities and concerns Recent Community Engagement
 - Goals

- Generate awareness, enthusiasm and trust
- Strengthen partner involvement
- Increase media and public exposure
- Gather feedback + votes for the BRT station design and logo/branding
- Also held a Metro employee open house
- Upcoming council meetings and community events
- Station to station area walks
 - They walked the blocks around proposed station locations
 - Spoke to business owners
 - It looked like Family Dollar, Hook Fish & Chicken, and Bacall's were the only CH businesses on the list of those they had spoken to
 - They said to please let them know if there is any other business they should speak to
- Had over 2,500 survey results (survey is still active on the website) on the 3 BRT branding options proposed + 300 comments
 - These go to their STEER committee which is made up of a diverse group of 20 individuals who will review the survey responses and feedback

Station Design

- 3 prototype options; it seems the suspended roof option is the design they plan to move forward with (you can view on their website)
- DNK architects and WSP National office will help with design; both worked on the streetcar design
- Design will be scaled for different locations 3 piers will likely be full-size
- They are working with 0 vision initiative (clean sight lines throughout) and ADA compliant
- Working on integrating pedestrian traffic, downlighting for visibility at stations
- 3 stations will be located in the middle of the road (access on both sides)
- Over 40 will be one sided/one lane
- Design is 0 load or near 0 level boarding so bikes, strollers, wheelchairs, etc can wheel right on

Next Steps

- Planning study
 - Evaluated different patterns for existing bus usage and used those to help pinpoint and plan in what areas stations should be located
 - Next will be deciding actual location of platforms
- Focusing on impacting traffic flow as minimally as possible
- 3 upcoming public meetings (see cards please register if attending)
- Additional surveys are ongoing
- Attempting to stay within existing roadways to minimize impact on residents and businesses and also plan to impact parking as minimally as possible to reduce parking loss
- One of the goals of the BRT is to help improve/fix existing traffic signaling to alleviate and avoid congestion
- There will be a BRT vehicle demonstration in February

- There is currently one manufacturer of BRT buses in the US; there is one more that will hopefully be ready by the time this project is started
- Metro has asked this company to borrow buses for the month of February
- If Metro is going to invest in a vehicle, they want to make sure it performs as they have been told it will
- They chose February because it will be cold; they want to see if the bus can get it's full charge in poor weather conditions and also ensure it can make it up the Vine Street grade
- The BRT bus will be electric, but Metro has also asked to see a clean diesel option as well
- The demonstration will allow stakeholder to go onto the bus while it is stopped to see the interior, but any test drives will have no passengers on board
- Metro is using construction management at-risk procurement

Engagement

- Currently about 15-20% designed
- Goal is to be 30% designed in February
- Asking for community input on station locations
- Asking everyone to promote the public meetings
- Says there will be consideration of traffic calming measures as well as traffic and parking studies in their designs
- Safety/security (policing) and maintenance responsibilities/agreements will also be part of their plan
- At December public meetings they will have designs with some to-scale stations
- Side station footprint will be 50'x10' as the standard but can be scaled depending on location
- Next stakeholder meeting is in February
- Answers to most questions were: conversations are happening, studies are going on, schedule to meet with someone from Metro to share concerns, there will be opportunities for input
